SERENITY SEEKERS
COMMITTEE MEETING
MAY 3, 1987

The May 3rd meeting was held in Cheyenne, WY at 803 W. 21st St. Shortly after 2:00 PM, Keith L. opened the meeting, leading the 11 members present, in the Serenity Prayer. Christy B. read the Twelve Traditions and Richard read the minutes from the last meeting. The minutes were approved, after a correction was made in the amount turned in on T-shirt sales.

H&I SUB-COMMITTEE:

In Steve Hs absence Jacque S. gave the H&I report. She stated the V.A. meetings were cancelled. There is one meeting a week being held at the Womens Correctional Center in Lusk, WY. At the last one members from Sheridan and Casper WY attended. At this point Murphy W. reported on the meeting just approved by the WY State Pen. He stated that the first one would be held on Sat. May 9, 1987, beginning at 6:30 PM and lasting until 8:30 PM. Prior clearance is needed for members to attend. Murphy has to send in a list of names, with addresses and DOBs, of interested parties. To qualify for admittance one must have been out of an institution for a period of two years, or written permission from a PO, and at least 6 months clean time or in the presence of a sponsor. All prison rules must be adhered to. On a final note, there is a lot of participation from the CAC.

PI SUB-COMMITTEE:

Murphy W. stated that the PI situation was the same as at the last report.

LITERATURE SUB-COMMITTEE:

A letter was received from the NE Regional Office informing us of their next RSC and including an up-dated meeting list. The Scottsbluff meeting was listed in error and the Secretary said that he would write David and get it up-dated.

ENTERTAINMENT COMMITTEE:

In Ron Ns absence Richard M. mentioned that Ron was planning for the campout.. The Cheyenne groups expressed an interest in hosting the WSUC for 1988! They have done some preliminary research. More in new business.

GSR REPORTS:

John, from the Funaddicts Group, reported that things were working out well with 8 to 10 new members who are coming fairly regularly. They are financially ok. He asked the question, "How can we hold members?". The answer being to promote unity in the fellowship. The CAC attendance is up and down.

Jacque S., from the Gift of Life Group, stated that the meetings are getting smaller due to the meeting times. Some different times have been tried with little support. There are still people opening up. They are financially a little better off than before having taken steps to prevent future pilfering. Elections of Trusted Servants are coming up on June 1st. The Tues., Wed., and Fri. 5:30 PM meetings are very slow.

Keith, from the Clean and Serene Group, stated that the Group has moved into a building completely unaffiliated with any other group, fellowship, or organization. The membership has increased to the point where it was decided to start holding meetings every night of the week. It is still too early to tell for sure but it seems that they are financially doing well enough to meet all of the new responsibilities. Most H&I and PI projects which involve spending money have been put on hold until the Group knows more about donations and utility bills. Two new radio stations have started announcing PSAs and the others, including the paper, have been given updated meeting lists.

ASR REPORT:

Joe stated that Jim, from the RSO, has received reports from all three of the active Areas and is currently attending the WSC in Calif.

OLD BUSINESS:

The by-laws, handed down by the Region, were discussed and voted on. There were three main areas of discussion.

1. Paragraph IV- section B and Par. V- Sec. E. John made a motion to change the wording to read non-voting participant instead of non-participant. Jacque seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.
2. Par. VI- Sec. A- SubPar. 2- Seca and Par. VII- Sec. E. Joe made a motion to strike the word three. Manny seconded the motion and all were in favor.
3. Par. IX- Sec. A-1. Joe made a motion to add, at the end of the sentence, without contact or representation. Jacque seconded the motion and 2 were for and 1 was against. Passed.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1) It was brought up to make a bid for the WSUC-1988, on behalf of the Region with Cheyenne hosting. It was mentioned that the 1988 conv. could be the last chance for the Region to host due to the available conv. facilities. John made a motion to bring it to the RSC to submit a bid for the WSUC V in 1988. Murphy seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.
- 2) John made a motion to have the 2nd Annual Serenity Seekers Summer Camp-out on June 6th & 7th at the Oliver Lake Res. Mark seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.
After voting on several themes suggested, "Fireside Fellowship & Sunshine Serenity", was chosen.
- 3) Election of Trusted Servants.
 - a. ASR Murphy nominated Mark L. Voted in unanimously.
 - b. ASR Alt. - Mark made a motion to table the election of an Alt. until after the next RSC or until someone volunteered. John seconded the motion and all were in favor.
 - c. Chairperson- Mark nominated Christy B. and John seconded. All were in favor.
 - d. Secretary- John nominated Kathy and Joe seconded the nomination. Kathy declined the nomination. Keith nominated Richard M. and Christy B. seconded the nomination. Passed unanimously.
 - e. Treasurer- Christy nominated Kathy. John seconded the nomination and all were in favor.
